12. Course Completion: Defined as the successful completion of a language program of study. DLIFLC has identified a separate stretch goal using a separate metric benchmark than the current institution-set standard. The stretch goal is for 40% of basic course students to graduate with a L2+/R2+/S1+, and 10% to graduate with L3/R3/S1+. FY23 Basic Course stretch goal metrics are 35% and 8.5%, respectively, for the higher standards.

13. All students who complete a language program receive a linguist certificate, the stretch goal is linked to the course completion goal, not the number of certificates.

14 & 15 The military services do not require DLIFLC graduates to have a degree in order to perform their military jobs. However, possessing a degree may help a service member advance in rank.
