Abstract: The Presidio of Monterey Historical Collection consists of 7 cubic feet of records regarding the history of the Presidio of Monterey from the 1500's to 1980s, as well as local historical information and photos. Military units included are the 1st, 10th, 8th, 9th, and 11th Cavalry, the 12th and 20th infantry, as well as the 76th Field Artillery, CMTC, ROTC, and CASA. The subject matter consists of marches, maneuvers, parades, training, training, individuals, and general images of camp life. Also included are images of early Monterey, specifically the landing of Viscaino and Father Serra, as well as downtown and Cannery Row scenes.
